Drop in sessions

Tax Free Childcare

You can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. This goes up to £1,000 every 3 months if a child is disabled (up to £4,000 a year).

- All children are required to bring in their own healthy packed lunch. We kindly ask parents to bring in an extra water bottle for their child to keep them hydrated.
- Early Years & KS1 arrival and registration starts at 8:30am.
- <u>KS2 arrival and registration is at 9:30am</u> and we aim to finish Sports day by 3:00pm.
- You do not need to attend Sports Day if you have a KS1/2 child. You may drop your child off accordingly at either 8:30am (KS1) or 9:30am (KS2) and collect them at 3:00pm.
- If your children are siblings in KS1 & 2, you may drop them off at 8:30am.
- <u>Early Years will finish at 10:45am</u>. Please ensure Parents are with them at all times.
- We are inviting all parents to come and support their children as family presence raises childrens' self-esteem and motivates them.
- Please park appropriately. There is free off street parking on Green Lane. There is also a public car park outside the stadium which belongs to Isaac Newton, however there are restrictions in place, please check beforehand.
- Please come prepared depending on weather conditions.
- Children should wear sun hats and apply sun cream for protection from the heat.


